News Highlights

- Due to weak buying by dal mills, the domestic market witnessed a decline in the prices of tur (pigeon pea) and urad (black gram). During the same period, chana (gram) prices strengthened. Moong (green gram) showed a mixed trend, while prices of desi masoor (lentil) remained stable, and imported masoor prices declined. The prices of imported urad (SQ and FAQ) from Myanmar remained stable in Chennai.
- Due to weak demand from dal mills, the prices of both imported and domestic urad (black gram) softened, while the rates of urad FAQ and SQ remained almost stable in Chennai. According to traders, the arrival of domestic urad in producing states' mandis has increased compared to earlier, and millers are purchasing only as per their immediate requirements, keeping the new crop in mind.
- Weak demand from dal mills led to a decline in the prices of both domestic and lemon tur (pigeon pea). However, in Chennai, the price of lemon tur remained stable in dollar terms. According to traders, importers and stockists are attempting to raise prices and offload their stocks ahead of increased arrivals of the new crop. However, they are not receiving support from millers' demand. Millers are focused on the new tur crop expected next month and are currently purchasing only as per their immediate requirements.
- The prices of chana (gram) have risen by ₹50 due to increased buying by dal mills. Traders report a shortage of good-quality chana in major producing mandis, leading to weak selling pressure. Moreover, with the marriage season underway, the demand for chana dal and besan (gram flour) is expected to remain strong. As a result, demand from dal mills for chana is likely to persist. Millers have limited leftover stocks, while the arrival of the new chana crop is still several months away.
- In Delhi, desi masoor prices remained stable, while imported masoor saw a slight decline. Demand from states like Bihar, Bengal, and Assam is steady due to the consumption season, prompting mills to continue buying. Limited arrivals in Madhya Pradesh and Uttar Pradesh mandis, along with stockists' reluctance to lower prices, indicate that a significant drop in masoor prices is unlikely.
- Moong prices weakened in Delhi but increased in Akola for shiny moong, while remaining stable in other mandis.
 New crop arrivals have risen in producing states, and higher sowing during the current kharif season has led to increased production estimates. In Delhi, supplies from Rajasthan are reducing demand for moong from Uttar Pradesh and Madhya Pradesh.
- As of November 26, 2024, under the Kharif season 2024 procurement scheme (PSS), NAFED has procured a total of 23,686 MT of moong in Karnataka.
- Rain and thunderstorms affected much of Western Australia and southeastern Australia due to low-pressure systems. Severe storms hit Queensland and northeastern New South Wales, with widespread rainfall of 15-50mm in several states. Some areas saw higher totals of 50-100mm, and the highest rainfall was 252mm at Tweed Heads Golf Club, NSW. The highest daily total was 155mm at Coolangatta, Queensland, on November 22.
