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News Highlights

- The India Meteorological Department (IMD) has forecast an early southwest monsoon onset over Kerala on May 27, five days ahead of the usual date. This early arrival is crucial for agriculture, enabling timely sowing of Kharif crops and aiding better seasonal planning for farmers.
- Farmers in Gujarat can register for the procurement of summer moong at the Minimum Support Price (MSP) of ₹8682 per quintal between May 15 and May 25, 2025.
- The Madhya Pradesh government has announced that farmers can register to sell their summer moong crop at the Minimum Support Price (MSP) of ₹8,682 per quintal from May 20 to June 5, 2025.
- Vessel M.V. XIN HAI TONG 59, carrying 50,288.405 MT of Yellow Peas from Russia, is expected to arrive at Mundra Port on May 21, 2025, as per shipping agency reports.
- Chana and mustard are being procured at MSP across 222 centers in Rajasthan by NCCF Jaipur and Rangpur, with payments made within 72 hours. Inactive centers will be supported through FPOs and farmer organizations to ensure smooth and uninterrupted procurement for farmers.
- The Gujarat government will procure summer moong at the MSP of ₹8,682/quintal to support farmers facing lower market prices ₹6,772. Farmers can register for MSP sales via e-Gram centers from May 15–25, 2025, with no registration fee, using NAFED's e-Samridhi portal.
- Canada's March 31 report showed a notable rise in pulse inventories, with dry field pea stocks increasing by 42% to 1.356 million MT rebounding to levels last seen before 2008. Lentil stocks also grew by 30.3% to 1.048 million MT, marking a recovery from the lows recorded in 2016.
- Russia lost 100,000 hectares of sown area due to frost and low temperatures, ten times less than last year. The Ministry of Agriculture said sufficient moisture could compensate for losses, and the impact on pulse crops like peas, chickpeas, and lentils is expected to be minimal.
- In Canada, timely rains in Estevan, Saskatchewan have enabled farmers to begin seeding peas, according to the Manitoba Cooperator. Conditions for planting were described as "probably perfect," with good soil moisture; however, there is concern that additional rainfall is needed soon as dryness is increasing.
- In the USA, July and August are forecasted to bring above-normal temperatures across the Midwestern growing regions. If the current warm and dry trend continues, declining soil moisture could become a serious issue just as crops reach their peak water needs, warns AgWeek.
- The Indonesian Palm Oil Association (GAPKI) has urged the government to delay increasing palm oil export duties, warning it would hurt competitiveness amid US biodiesel mandate delays, high crude oil output, and weak global demand, keeping short-term price pressure.
