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### News Highlights

- The IMD has issued alerts as heavy rain continues across parts of India. Himachal Pradesh saw 11 cloudbursts, flash floods, and a major landslide in Mandi, claiming 13 lives. An orange alert is in place, with more rain expected. East Rajasthan may receive extremely heavy rainfall on July 3, while Himachal and Uttarakhand are likely to see very heavy rain between July 5–7.
- As of July 2, 2025, Kharif pulses sowing in Andhra Pradesh has declined significantly, with total coverage at just 0.015 million hectares—down 61.54% from 0.039 million hectares during the same period last year. The sharpest drop is seen in tur, which fell by 77.14% to 0.06 lakh hectares. Moong also saw a slight decline, while urad sowing has shown improvement, increasing to 0.006 million hectares from zero last year.
- As of July 2, 2025, Kharif pulses sowing in Telangana reached 0.306 million acres, marking an 18.19% increase over the same period last year. Tur and urad recorded strong growth of 23.04% and 23.45% respectively, while moong declined by 16.15%. Sowing of other pulses also dropped by 42.84% compared to 2024.
- The Madhya Pradesh government will begin summer moong procurement from July 7 to August 8, 2025, across 36 districts. The procurement will be conducted at the Minimum Support Price (MSP) of ₹8,682 per quintal. Each farmer will be allowed to sell up to 12 quintals per hectare, with a maximum cap of 100 quintals per farmer.
- As per the NAFED auction held on June 30, 2025, Chana (R-22) from Madhya Pradesh was auctioned at prices ranging between ₹5049 and ₹5103 per quintal. Moong (K-24) from Rajasthan fetched ₹6714, while the previous season's Moong (K-23) was sold at ₹6152. In Karnataka, Moong (K-24) was auctioned at ₹6311. Masoor (R-24) from Madhya Pradesh recorded a uniform auction price of ₹6011 per quintal.
- Continued rainfall is essential for the Canadian Prairies and the U.S. Northern Plains, particularly as row crops in the U.S. approach the critical pollination stage by mid-July. Weather conditions remain generally favourable, with forecasts indicating expected rainfall of approximately one inch across most parts of Western Australia, South Australia, and Victoria in the coming week.
- Field pea acreage in Canada rose by 9.1% in 2025, driven by a 20.5% increase in Alberta, mainly in yellow peas, while Saskatchewan saw a drop in yellow peas but a 23% rise in green peas. Chickpea area also grew by 12.5% to 541,000 acres, as some lentil growers switched crops to manage root rot.
- Global edible oil prices showed a mixed trend. While Malaysian palm oil prices rose, soybean oil closed weaker in Chicago. Traders attribute tight global supply to reduced soy oil exports from Argentina and U.S. biodiesel policies, supporting palm oil prices. Domestically, upcoming festive demand and lower June production estimates in Malaysia are also lending support to the market.
