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News Highlights

- IMD has issued a red alert for extremely heavy rainfall over Coastal Karnataka and Telangana, with showers likely to persist till September 2. Isolated heavy to very heavy rain is also forecast for Andhra Pradesh, Kerala, Tamil Nadu, and interior Karnataka between August 27–29.
- The agriculture minister has urged the imposition of a 50% duty on yellow pea imports, warning that duty-free inflows are depressing domestic pulse prices. In a note to the food minister, it was cautioned that unchecked imports could discourage farmers from expanding acreage under pulses. Source: financialexpress.
- Between August 4–21, 2025, Chennai port received significant pulse imports led by Brazil Urad 20,880 MT in 870 containers and Burma Urad 11,928 MT in 497 containers. Other major arrivals included Burma Tur 6,600 MT, Burma Rajma 504 MT, and Brazil Brown Eye Beans 816 MT. Smaller volumes of Kenya Urad, cowpeas, and Madagascan beans were also recorded.
- In NAFED's auction held on August 27, 2025, Moong from Rajasthan (K-24) was traded in the range of ₹7,004— ₹7,257 per quintal. Masoor from Madhya Pradesh (R-25) fetched a high of ₹7,561 per quintal, reflecting steady demand in the market.
- In Chennai, Urad FAQ and SQ prices eased slightly in dollar terms, while in Burma, FAQ rates strengthened and SQ remained steady. In the domestic market, millers limited buying kept prices mixed. Traders expect higher imports along with the upcoming domestic crop, prompting mills to purchase only as needed. New domestic arrivals are likely to carry higher moisture, which may keep stockists buying weak until the end of September.
- In Chennai, Lemon Tur prices softened in dollar terms, while rates in Burma stayed steady. Domestic markets saw a mixed trend as millers purchased only as per need, with cheaper African imports capping demand. Traders said dal consumption to rise in the coming weeks, though price movement will also depend on monsoon conditions in key producing states.
- Pulses prices in mandis have fallen below MSP due to cheaper imports from Myanmar, Mozambique, Tanzania, and Canada. Traders caution that this could impact upcoming rabi sowing of chana and masoor, calling for higher import duties to safeguard farmers' returns.
- Good rains across Australia's grainbelt in July-August have boosted crop prospects, with ABARES likely to revise estimates upward. Western Australia shows the strongest improvement, while South Australia and Victoria are on track for average yields, and Queensland expects another bumper crop.
- Russia is projected to achieve a robust pulse harvest in 2025, with output estimated at 4.5 million MT of peas,
 0.8 million MT of chickpeas, and 0.6 million MT of lentils. Expanded acreage has offset regional weather
 challenges. However, despite the ample supply, prices are under pressure due to subdued demand from India
 and China. The buyers in major markets acknowledges that the quality of Russian pulses is comparable to
 Canadian pulses.

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
