News Highlights

- *IMD has forecast cold wave conditions in north and central India, with night temperatures 2–4°C below normal in parts of Haryana and northwest India. A slight temperature drop is expected in the Northeast, while light to moderate rain and thunderstorms may occur over Kerala, Tamil Nadu, and nearby regions in the next two days.*
- *Vessel *M.V. SEA EAGLE*, carrying 38,506.120 MT of Desi Chickpeas (Chana) from Australia, is expected to arrive at Kandla Port on November 13, 2025, as per shipping agency reports.*
- *As of November 10, 2025, Maharashtra's Rabi pulses sowing stood 31.1% lower year-on-year, with total coverage at 0.47 million hectares compared to 0.69 million hectares last year. Chana (gram) sowing has seen the sharpest decline, down 42.4% to 0.34 million hectares from 0.59 million hectares, while other pulses dropped 1.5% to 0.13 million hectares. The shortfall highlights delayed sowing progress amid unfavorable weather conditions.*
- *As of 10th November 2025, Gujarat's Rabi pulses sowing shows mixed trends. The area under Chana has risen sharply by 159.8%, while other pulses have declined by 72.84%. Overall, the total Rabi pulses area has seen a slight decrease of 1.66% compared to last year.*
- *India's food inflation dropped to a 30-month low of -2.28% in September 2025, driven by falling prices of major food commodities and a high base effect. While this offers relief to consumers, persistently low prices below MSP are hurting farmers' incomes and discouraging crop cultivation. Globally, foodgrain prices fell by around 11.5% in 2025, with rice recording the sharpest 30% decline, reflecting the need for policies that ensure remunerative returns for farmers.*
- *Australia Weather: Low-pressure troughs and systems brought widespread thunderstorms, showers, and localized hail across New South Wales and southern Queensland, along with rainfall in Victoria, Tasmania, and southern parts of Western and South Australia. Northern regions also saw heavy rain from severe storms. Weekly rainfall ranged mostly between 10–100 mm, with the highest total of 154 mm recorded at Mount Baw Baw (Victoria) and a daily peak of 88 mm at Highbury Station (Queensland) on November 9.*
- *The International Grains Council (IGC) projects global soybean consumption to hit a record 430 million MT in 2025/26, driven by rising demand for meat and animal feed, especially in Asia. Despite good harvests—led by Brazil's record 177 million MT—production lags behind consumption, causing the first stock decline in years. Global trade remains strong, with Brazil dominating exports and China leading imports.*
