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News Highlights

- An early-season cold wave has set in across India, with minimum temperatures dipping well below normal in the northern plains, central India, and Maharashtra. Several states, including Madhya Pradesh and Maharashtra, are under cold wave conditions, while Delhi has recorded its earliest single-digit minimum in more than ten years. Strong northwesterly winds are largely responsible for this unusual and widespread chill.
- The Centre has approved the proposals from Andhra Pradesh and Rajasthan to purchase Kharif crops under the Market Intervention Scheme (MIS) at MSP, providing over ₹9,700 crore in support to farmers. Rajasthan received approval for large-scale MSP procurement of moong, urad, groundnut, and soybean, while Andhra Pradesh was cleared for MSP buying of 37,273 MT of groundnut and MIS procurement of 97,887 MT of onion. The government said this decision will ensure fair prices, market stability and timely payments to farmers.
- Early sowing and a timely onset of winter have boosted rabi crop coverage, with the total sown area rising 10.3% to 20.82 million hectares as of November 14. Wheat acreage is up 17%, while pulses—especially chana and masoor—have also seen strong expansion. Barley acreage has surged by 50%. With improved weather and higher coverage, farmers expect better yields, supporting the government's foodgrain production target of 171.14 mt for 2024–25.
- Rabi pulses sowing in Gujarat for the 2025–26 season, compared with the same period last year (as of 17th November 2025). The total area under pulses has decreased significantly by 33.2%, falling from 1,93,196 hectares last year to 1,20,052 hectares this year. The area under chana (gram) has declined by 9.42%, while the category of other pulses shows a sharp drop of 84.69%.
- Vessel M.V. LIMCO GOLD, carrying 9,228 MT of Tur from Mozambique, has arrived at Mumbai port on November 17, 2025, according to shipping agency reports.
- Chennai port received 27,625 MT of pulses in 1,105 containers between 3rd–10th Nov 2025, led by large arrivals of Brazil Urad, Burma Urad, and Burma Tur. Smaller shipments of Tur from Tanzania, Malawi, and Kenya, along with cow peas and rajma, also reached the port.
- Australia Weather: A series of surface troughs and abundant tropical moisture produced widespread thunderstorms across central, northern and eastern Australia, extending into northern New South Wales. Many regions in the north and east received 50–100+ mm, while parts of WA, NT and SA saw 5–50 mm. Southern states also picked up rain from passing fronts, with 5–50 mm across SA, Victoria and Tasmania, and more than 50 mm in western Tasmania and Victoria's eastern ranges. The week's highest total was 283 mm at Charles Point, NT, including 228 mm in a single day.
