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News Highlights

- *The IMD's All India Weather Summary indicates light rainfall/snowfall over the western Himalayan region and isolated rain over parts of northwest India. Minimum temperatures remain low across north and central India, with dense to very dense fog and cold wave conditions likely in several regions over the next few days.*
- *India has launched the ₹11,440 crore **Mission for Aatmanirbharta in Pulses** to achieve full self-sufficiency in pulse production by 2030–31, with assured MSP procurement, large-scale seed support, and value-chain development. The mission targets higher output, reduced imports, improved farmer incomes, and strengthened nutrition and soil health across the country.*
- *Chana prices in Delhi remained stable due to limited buying by dal mills and reduced selling by stockists. Demand for chana dal and besan stays steady, while large imports from Australia are expected this month. The new domestic crop will arrive in March-April, with most good-quality stock already sold.*
- *Global agricultural commodity prices firming in 2026 as new markets and uses boost demand, though gains may be limited. BMI expects grain prices to rise on an annual average basis, but strong 2025-26 output will cap upside, while ABARES projects continued pressure from record global production.*
- *India and Argentina have signed an ICAR–INTA Work Plan for 2025–2027 to deepen cooperation in agricultural research, technology exchange and capacity building. The partnership will focus on oilseeds and pulses, mechanisation, sustainable agronomy, plant and animal health, digital agriculture and value-chain development, with collaboration through joint research, germplasm exchange and training programmes.*
- *Turkey has sharply increased lentil imports in the 2025-26 season after domestic production nearly halved to 260,000 MT due to adverse weather. Imports rose to 243,000 MT during July–October, up from 181,000 MT a year earlier, with Kazakhstan and Russia gaining market share alongside Canada.*
- *Australia Weather: Widespread showers and thunderstorms affected northern and eastern Australia during the week, with many regions recording 25–100 mm of rainfall. The heaviest falls were in the Northern Territory, where Tipperary received 195 mm for the week, including a daily peak of 119 mm, while cold fronts also brought rain to parts of the south-east and western Tasmania.*
- *In the global market, edible oil prices showed a mixed trend during the evening session. Malaysian palm oil prices saw a slight recovery, while soybean oil prices weakened and closed lower. According to experts, crude palm oil (CPO) futures on the BMD closed with mild strength on Wednesday. The market was under pressure until midday, but support from the energy market and selective short-covering later helped curb the selling.*

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
