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News Highlights

- Dense fog blanketed large parts of north India, prompting the IMD to issue a red alert for Delhi as visibility dropped to near zero in several cities, disrupting road, rail and air traffic. Delhi's air quality remained alarming in the 'very poor' to 'severe' range, with stricter pollution control measures enforced and poor conditions likely to persist over the weekend.
- The vessel MV Seastar Vulcan, carrying about 33,000 MT of Australian desi chickpeas (chana), arrived at Kandla Port on 16 December 2025, according to shipping agency reports.
- In Maharashtra, rabi pulses sowing as of 16 December stood at 4.15 million hectares, up 1.17% year on year. Chana acreage increased 0.82% to 2.30 million hectares, while other pulses were planted on 1.85 million hectares, reflecting steady sowing progress this season.
- Rajasthan has recorded a sharp rise in chana sowing this season, with acreage reaching 2.22 million hectares as of December 18, well above 1.66 million hectares last year and exceeding the state's target of 2.15 million hectares. Favorable weather and healthy crop conditions support positive production prospects, with harvesting expected from February–March 2026.
- As per NAFED's auction results dated 17 December 2025, chana prices in Madhya Pradesh (R-25) traded in the range of ₹5,130–5,168 per quintal. Moong prices were quoted at ₹6,601 per quintal in Odisha (R-25), while Madhya Pradesh recorded ₹5,601 for S-23 and ₹7,215 for S-25. Mustard seed prices ranged between ₹6,507–6,533 in Madhya Pradesh, around ₹6,601–6,603 in Haryana, and about ₹6,625 per quintal in Rajasthan.
- Chennai Tur prices for 25-grade remained steady, while urad also traded unchanged. Demand in lemon urad (FAQ/SQ) stayed slow, with buying largely need-based, as millers continued to procure tur and urad cautiously in line with immediate requirements.
- Domestic chana is under pressure due to weak demand. Australian chana at the port fell \$25–50/ton, but millers are buying only as needed. Sowing and crop conditions in India are good. Prices will depend on domestic production and government import/purchase policies.
- Karnataka will begin MSP procurement registration for tur at ₹7,800 per quintal, starting December 17 in Raichur and December 22 in Yadgir and Bijapur, as per sources. The state plans to procure up to 4 quintals per acre per farmer over a 90-day period, following Centre's approval to buy 0.96 million MT, with NAFED and NCCF directed to initiate purchases promptly.

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
