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### News Highlights

- A severe cold wave continues across North India, prompting Rajasthan to extend school holidays and revise class timings as temperatures dip near freezing. Delhi recorded a low of 2.9°C, among the coldest this season, and IMD has warned that harsh conditions may persist for a few more days before easing after mid-January.
- The USDA's final estimate puts the 2025 U.S. lentil crop at 10.6 million cwt (about 0.48 million MT), up 17% year-on-year, supported by higher acreage and improved yields. Planted area rose 15% to 1.07 million acres, harvested area increased 5% to 949,000 acres, with yields improving to 1,112 pounds per acre.
- U.S. chickpea production in 2025 is estimated at 6.84 million cwt (about 0.31 million MT), up 20% from 2024, supported by higher acreage and improved yields. Planted area rose 6% to 536,000 acres, harvested area increased 5% to 520,300 acres, with yields improving to 1,315 pounds per acre.
- U.S. dry edible pea production in 2025 is estimated at 18.5 million cwt (about 0.83 million MT), up 9% year-on-year, driven by a sharp rise in acreage. Planted area increased 19% to 1.17 million acres and harvested area rose 11% to 1.06 million acres, while yields edged slightly lower to 1,738 pounds per acre.
- Australia's pulse exports surged in November, with chickpea shipments jumping to 388,832 MT and lentil exports rising to 270,151 MT on the back of new-crop availability. India remained the dominant destination for both pulses, reflecting strong demand and ample supplies from what is shaping up to be a potentially record Australian lentil harvest.
- Australia Weather: Tropical Cyclone Koji brought widespread heavy rainfall across eastern and tropical Queensland after making landfall as a Category 1 system, causing flooding in already saturated coastal areas. Weekly rainfall reached up to 300 mm across large parts of Queensland, with the highest total of 395 mm recorded at Mt Jukes, while showers and thunderstorms also affected New South Wales, the Northern Territory, Western Australia and Tasmania.
- In the global market, edible oil prices showed a mixed trend during the evening session. Malaysian palm oil futures ended lower, while soybean oil prices moved higher. Traders said that crude palm oil (CPO) futures on the BMD closed weaker on Tuesday, erasing early gains, as investors focused on short-term demand amid developments related to Indonesia's biodiesel policy.

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
