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News Highlights

- Northern India is set to remain under cold wave to severe cold wave conditions over the next few days, with the IMD issuing warnings for Delhi-NCR, Punjab, Haryana, Rajasthan, Uttar Pradesh, Uttarakhand and Himachal Pradesh. Dense fog is also likely to persist across several states, disrupting transport, while prolonged extreme cold may pose risks to health, agriculture and daily life.
- Jharkhand is likely to resume chana dal distribution to over 6.8 million ration card-holding families from February under the Chief Minister Dal Distribution Scheme, after a 20-month gap. The state has allocated around ₹300 crore, with supplies to be handled by a private firm and distributed through more than 25,000 PDS shops.
- New chana arrivals have started in Kurnool (Andhra Pradesh), with production reported to be excellent this year. Bumper output is also expected in Karnataka, Tamil Nadu and Telangana, and arrivals are likely to pick up sharply over the next 10–15 days.
- China's pulses consumption declined to 6.9 million MT in 2024 after peaking in 2023, though the long-term trend remains positive, with demand projected to reach 7.6 million MT by 2035. Domestic production of about 4.8 million MT remains insufficient, keeping China a major importer—mainly of dry peas from Russia and Canada—while market value is forecast to rise to \$6.4 billion.
- Lentil prices are moving sideways following Australia's 2025-26 winter pulse harvest, which delivered a record crop of about 1.91 million MT. Port prices have remained largely unchanged since early December amid slow liquidity, weak demand and harvest delays, while trading activity is improving slightly in South Australia as exporters work to fill nearby vessel shipments, leaving the overall market direction neutral.
- Chickpea prices remain range-bound after Australia's 2024-25 winter pulse harvest, despite a large crop and improving grower selling in parts of northern Australia. Export demand has picked up modestly with shipments from Brisbane, but expectations of a strong Indian rabi crop and a 10% import tariff are limiting upside, prompting growers to hold stocks in anticipation of better prices.

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
