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### News Highlights

- A fresh western disturbance is set to bring rain, thunderstorms and hail to Delhi and parts of north India, the IMD said. Widespread rain or snowfall is likely over the Western Himalayas, with fog, cold wave conditions and gusty winds in isolated areas.
- India's 2025-26 Rabi pulse sowing reached 15.41 million hectares as of January 23, up 3% from 14.96 million hectares a year earlier. Gram acreage increased to 10.70 million ha (from 10.19 million ha) and lentils to 1.72 million ha (from 1.65 million ha), while urad slipped to 0.62 million ha (from 0.66 million ha) and moong to 0.18 million ha (from 0.20 million ha).
- Union Agriculture Minister Shivraj Singh Chouhan approved the procurement of 0.34 million MT of tur (pigeon pea) in Maharashtra under the Price Support Scheme, worth around Rs 2,696 crore. He directed NAFED, NCCF, and state officials to ensure direct, transparent procurement from farmers, reducing middlemen and maximizing benefits. Chouhan emphasized using modern technology for farmer registration and increasing procurement centres if needed.
- In 2025, total Tur imports fell 7.7% YoY to 10,54,965 MT from 11,43,139 MT in 2024. April, May, and November saw sharp rises, while February, March, and the mid-year months recorded steep declines. Mozambique, Burma, and Tanzania remained the top suppliers, with notable spikes in October–November likely linked to seasonal demand.
- Moong exports during Jan–Nov 2025 rose sharply to about 0.12 million MT, up from 0.02 million MT in the same period last year, supported by strong demand from China. China, the U.S. and Indonesia were the key buyers, driving a significant year-on-year increase in shipments.
- Kabuli chana exports during Jan–Nov 2025 jumped to about 0.59 million MT, compared with 0.11 million MT in the same period last year, reflecting strong global demand. The UAE, Turkey and Sri Lanka were the leading destinations, driving a more than fivefold year-on-year rise in export volumes.
- Global Weather remains a mixed influence on crops, with a more muted view emerging on U.S. winterkill risks as snow cover likely protected much of the winter wheat, despite localized damage. Meanwhile, southern Australia continues to face an intense heatwave, with only brief relief in South Australia and Victoria before temperatures rebound, and Canberra forecast to reach 42°C, close to its 2020 record.
- In 2025, India's urad imports rose to 11,64,084 MT from 5,68,484 MT in 2024, driven largely by higher arrivals from Burma and Brazil. Key months with significant imports included April, October, and November, while mid-year months like June and July saw comparatively lower volumes. Overall, Burma remained the dominant supplier, followed by Brazil and smaller contributions from other origins.

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
