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News Highlights

- *The India Meteorological Department forecast thunderstorms, gusty winds, and isolated hail across northwest India, with light rain and snow in the western Himalayan region under a Western Disturbance. Dense fog may persist in parts of Odisha and Coastal Andhra Pradesh, while temperatures are expected to remain largely stable.*
- *The vessel M.V. SAMOA carrying 34,426.652 MT of red masoor from Canada is scheduled to arrive at Mundra Port on February 23, 2026, according to shipping agency reports.*
- *Tur prices in Chennai increased by ₹50, while urad gained ₹25–50, supported by reduced selling pressure due to lower stocks at the port. In Delhi, limited availability of lemon tur variety stocks also provided buying support to the market.*
- *Andhra Pradesh has floated a state tender for the supply of 1,687.500 MT of tur dal for the period April to June 2026.*
- *Andhra Pradesh has begun procuring 94,500 MT of Bengal gram under the Price Support Scheme for the 2025–26 Rabi season, with purchases to be carried out by National Agricultural Cooperative Marketing Federation of India and National Cooperative Consumers Federation of India, ensuring timely payments to farmers.*
- *Global Weather risk premium eased overnight as improving moisture and expanding snow cover across Russia lifted 2026-27 production prospects, while increased rain chances in dry areas of Argentina added pressure to grain markets, offsetting minor harvest delays in northern Brazil.*
- *Kazakhstan has stopped importing finished lentils from Turkey and is now exporting processed products after launching domestic processing and packaging facilities. The country ranks sixth globally in lentil exports and harvested a record 1 million MT of pulses this year, up 56% year-on-year, supporting plans to further diversify crop areas.*
- *U.S. soybean crush hit a January record of 221.6 million bushels, up 10.6% year-on-year, according to the National Oilseed Processors Association, while soybean oil stocks climbed to 1.9 billion pounds, the highest since April 2023 and above expectations.*

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
