Daily Pulses Report 11th March 2026

News Highlights

- According to the India Meteorological Department (IMD), above-normal daytime temperatures are likely across parts of Northwest and Central India in the coming days. Meanwhile, the Western Himalayan region may witness rainfall and snowfall until March 16, indicating mixed weather conditions across the country.
- Total pulses imports at Chennai reached 1,292 containers (32,300 MT) as of 24th Feb to 2nd March 2026. Tur imports from Myanmar (Burma) dominated the arrivals, while smaller volumes of Chana and other pulses were also recorded.
- Maharashtra has set a target to procure 0.34 million MT of Tur at MSP ₹8,000/qtl for 2025–26. However, since February 1, NAFED and National Cooperative Consumers' Federation of India Ltd. have purchased only 12,404.99 MT (3.68% of the target) from 7,202 farmers, indicating a slow procurement pace so far.
- India's Rabi Masoor production is estimated to rise 5% to 1.73 million MT in 2025–26, compared to 1.65 million MT last year. The increase is mainly supported by higher output in Uttar Pradesh and Madhya Pradesh, while some states like Jharkhand and Bihar show a decline.
- The Government has approved procurement of about 0.125 million MT of pulses and oilseeds from Telangana during the 2025–26 Rabi season at Minimum Support Price. The procurement, estimated to cost around ₹894 crore, will be carried out under the Price Support Scheme as part of the Pradhan Mantri Annadata Aay Sanrakshan Abhiyan (PM-AASHA) framework.
- Australia weather: Heavy rains and thunderstorms impacted northern Australia due to a monsoon trough and tropical lows, bringing 50–300 mm rainfall across parts of Western Australia, Northern Territory, and Queensland. Flooding has been reported in several areas, with the highest weekly rainfall of 415.2 mm at Whyanbeel Valley.
- The United States Department of Agriculture increased the global oilseed production forecast for MY 2025-26 to 697.54 million MT, mainly due to higher sunflower and rapeseed output, while soybean production was slightly reduced.
