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News Highlights

- According to India Meteorological Department, April–June 2026 may see warmer nights across India and higher heatwave frequency, especially in eastern, northeastern, and coastal regions. While many western and central areas could experience normal to below-normal daytime temperatures, above-normal heat and rainfall variability may impact crops and increase risks to health, water, and power demand.
- The Central government has approved procurement of over 1.8 million MT of pulses and oilseeds under MSP for Rabi 2025–26 across Haryana, Uttar Pradesh, and Karnataka, with an outlay above ₹11,698 crore. The move aims to support farmer prices, prevent distress sales, and strengthen domestic production through transparent, digitally-enabled procurement under PSS.
- The Uttar Pradesh Government will begin procurement of key Rabi crops at MSP from April 2 to June 30, covering gram, lentil, mustard, and tur. With defined MSP rates and targets, over 190 centres and Aadhaar-enabled systems aim to ensure transparent procurement and direct payments to farmers.
- NCCF has confirmed multiple sales under the Price Stabilisation Fund (PSS) dated 26 March 2026, covering commodities such as masoor, moong, and tur. The transactions include supplies from various warehouses in Bhopal and Jaipur, with prices ranging from around ₹5,353 to ₹8,051 per quintal and significant quantities traded, reflecting active market intervention to stabilize prices.
- NCCF has confirmed a sale under the Price Stabilisation Fund (PSF) dated 26 March 2026. The transaction includes imported masoor (lentil) from Australia/Canada, sold from CWC Kharagpur warehouse at ₹5,238 per quintal, with a total quantity of 26.63 MT.
- Global Weather conditions show limited rainfall in Kansas with only around 8 mm expected over the next two weeks, while temperatures are likely to rise back near 30°C. In Queensland and New South Wales, forecasts remain mixed across models, though some rainfall optimism persists; globally, weather conditions appear largely stable.
- According to USDA, U.S. lentil acreage is projected to fall 22% to 832,000 acres in 2026, while dry pea area may rise 3% to 1.17 million acres. Chickpea acreage is expected to decline 7% to 499,000 acres, including 116,000 acres of small and 383,000 acres of large chickpeas.

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
