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News Highlights

- Scorching heat, intense sunshine, and hot winds continue to affect daily life across North and Central India, with temperatures in several regions rising to 46–48°C. The India Meteorological Department (IMD) has issued severe heatwave alerts for states including Delhi, Uttar Pradesh, Punjab, Haryana, Rajasthan, and Madhya Pradesh as extreme weather conditions persist during May.
- Pulse markets showed mixed trends today. Chana prices rose sharply by ₹125–175 in major markets, while Tur remained mostly steady except Chennai gaining ₹100. Urad and yellow pea witnessed selective gains, whereas Masoor and Kabuli stayed largely unchanged.
- Around 48,320 MT of Canadian Red Lentils are expected to arrive at Mundra on 27 May 2026 through vessel M.V. LEM VERBENA. The shipment reflects continued steady imports of Masoor into India amid firm domestic demand and tight supply conditions in key consuming markets.
- India imported 0.28 million MT of urad during April 2025–March 2026, down 25% from 0.38 million MT imported in the previous year. Myanmar remained the largest supplier, while imports from Brazil, Tanzania and Mozambique also added to the total volume.
- India imported 1.48 million MT of tur during April 2025–March 2026, up 21% from 1.22 million MT imported in the previous year. Mozambique remained the largest supplier, followed by Myanmar and Malawi, while imports from Tanzania and Sudan also supported the higher arrivals.
- Global edible oil prices showed a mixed trend, with Malaysian palm oil rising over 1% while Chicago soybean oil declined. Malaysian palm oil futures gained on strong Chinese edible oil markets, fresh technical buying, and concerns over tighter Indonesian export supplies.
- Australia weather -A slow-moving high-pressure system brought persistent rainfall across parts of eastern Australia during the week, with coastal New South Wales and Queensland receiving 10 mm to over 100 mm rainfall. Tropical moisture and cloudband activity also supported widespread showers across southeastern regions, while cold fronts delivered light to moderate rain in southern areas. The highest weekly rainfall recorded was 247 mm at Topaz Alert, Queensland.
- Global soybean exports rose more than 11% year-on-year in early 2026, supported by strong global demand for oilseeds, according to Oil World. Brazil and the United States remained the leading exporters, while China continued to dominate imports with purchases rising to 38.08 million MT, alongside higher demand from countries such as Argentina, Pakistan, Thailand, and Vietnam.

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
