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News Highlights

- *The India Meteorological Department (IMD) has projected above-normal southwest monsoon rainfall at 106% of the Long Period Average (LPA) for June to September 2026, which is expected to support kharif crop sowing and improve soil moisture conditions. However, the possibility of El Niño developing during the monsoon season may still pose some risk to rainfall distribution and agricultural productivity in certain regions.*
- *The government has stated that it is fully prepared to manage any adverse impact of a possible El Niño on the 2026 kharif season through contingency planning, alternative crop arrangements, and seed availability measures. At the same time, the Centre is focusing on crop diversification, higher productivity, and achieving self-reliance in pulses and oilseeds amid concerns over below-normal monsoon rainfall projections.*
- *Madhya Pradesh has started registration for MSP procurement of summer moong and urad under the Price Support Scheme for the 2026-27 season, with registrations open from May 25 to June 15. The state has introduced mandatory Aadhaar-based biometric verification and online registration through the e-Uparjan portal to ensure transparent procurement and direct payment to farmers.*
- *Pulse markets traded mixed today, with tur prices strengthening in Akola and Solapur, while chana remained firm in Delhi and Bikaner. Urad and masoor prices were largely steady across major markets, whereas moong prices declined in Jabalpur and yellow pea gained in Kanpur, reflecting selective demand and limited trading activity.*
- *India's urad production for 2025-26 is estimated at 2.16 million MT, down 3.66% from last year's 2.24 million MT. Production is expected to decline sharply in major states such as Maharashtra, Madhya Pradesh, Rajasthan, and Andhra Pradesh, while Madhya Pradesh and Uttar Pradesh recorded higher summer urad output.*
- *India's tur production for Kharif 2025-26 is estimated at 3.59 million MT, slightly lower than last year's 3.62 million MT, according to the government's third advance estimates.*
- *India's chana production for 2025-26 is estimated at 12.61 million MT, up 12.6% from last year's 11.14 million MT, mainly driven by higher output in Maharashtra, Rajasthan, Andhra Pradesh, and Gujarat. However, production is expected to decline in Madhya Pradesh, Uttar Pradesh, Karnataka, and Jharkhand.*
- *India's masoor production for 2025-26 is estimated at 1.76 million MT, up 6.53% from last year's 1.65 million MT, mainly supported by higher output in Uttar Pradesh, Madhya Pradesh, and West Bengal. However, production is expected to decline in Bihar and Jharkhand.*
- *Government estimates India's moong production for 2024-25 at 4.49 million MT, up 5.34% from last year, mainly driven by higher output in Rajasthan, Odisha, Karnataka, and Haryana. However, production is expected to decline in Maharashtra, Madhya Pradesh, and Gujarat.*
