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News Highlights

- *The Southwest Monsoon has advanced further into parts of the Bay of Bengal and northeastern states, including the entire Nagaland, Manipur, and Mizoram. The IMD has forecast heavy to very heavy rainfall over Karnataka, Kerala, Sub-Himalayan West Bengal, and Sikkim, while light to moderate showers in Delhi brought relief from the prevailing heat and humidity.*
- *Today's Market: Tur prices weakened by ₹50/quintal in Akola, Solapur, and Chennai, while Chana remained mixed with a ₹25 decline in Delhi and a ₹50 gain in Bikaner. Urad prices eased by ₹50 in Chennai and Delhi SQ markets, whereas Moong gained ₹100 in Delhi amid steady trends elsewhere. Masoor and Matar remained largely stable, with minor declines in Kolkata and Kanpur respectively, while Kabuli Chana prices in Indore (42-44 count) were unchanged.*
- *Urad Market (Week Ending 6 June 2026): Imported Urad prices declined for the second consecutive week due to weak mill demand and steady Myanmar arrivals, while domestic summer Urad prices remained firm in key producing states on selective mill buying. Overall, higher arrivals and subdued demand are expected to keep Urad prices range-bound in the near term.*
- *Tur Market (Week Ending 6 June 2026): Tur prices declined for the second consecutive week as weak demand for Tur dal and limited buying by millers and traders weighed on sentiment. Additional pressure came from NCCF's auction sales and steady arrivals in Maharashtra markets. However, lower import parity, reduced import attractiveness, and emerging monsoon-related crop risks are expected to provide support, keeping Tur prices largely range-bound in the near term.*
- *Chana Market (Week Ending 6 June 2026): Chana prices eased after gaining for four consecutive weeks, as buyers turned cautious at higher levels and demand for Chana dal and besan remained slow. Increased farmer selling near or above MSP also weighed on prices. However, lower market arrivals and the possibility of improved demand are expected to provide support, keeping Chana prices largely range-bound in the near term.*
- *Global Pulses Update: AAFC has projected a sharp decline in Canada's pulse production for MY 2026/27, with pea output estimated at 2.95 million MT and lentil production at 2.35 million MT. Lower supplies from one of the world's largest pulse exporters could support global pulse prices and create export opportunities for other producing countries.*
- *Edible Oils Market Update: Global edible oil prices witnessed an upward trend. According to traders, BMD Palm Oil futures on Bursa Malaysia Derivatives closed slightly higher on Monday, supported by gains in crude oil and gasoil prices, a weaker Malaysian ringgit, and stronger Chicago soyoil futures.*
- *Palm Oil Market Outlook: Ahead of the official May data from the Malaysian Palm Oil Board (MPOB) due on 10 June, trade estimates suggest a mixed short-term outlook for Malaysian palm oil. Production is estimated at 1.55 million MT, down 4.9% from April, while exports are projected at 1.15 million MT, a decline of 11.74%. As a result, ending stocks are expected to rise by 1.95% to 2.354 million MT. However, traders are awaiting the official data for confirmation, as a larger-than-expected increase in stocks could limit further upside in palm oil prices.*
