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### News Highlights

- *IMD forecasts heavy rainfall over Northeast India over the next two days, with similar conditions in Bihar, East MP, East UP, Odisha and West Bengal today. Thunderstorms with lightning and gusty winds are also expected across several eastern and northeastern regions.*
- *Nafed PSS Chana Rabi-26 bids approved on 7 September 2026 totalled 5,229.62 MT, with Maharashtra at 3,540 MT, Gujarat at 1,160 MT, and Madhya Pradesh at 529.62 MT. Bid prices ranged from ₹6,401–6,565/quintal.*
- *Pulse sowing in Madhya Pradesh remained lower, with acreage down by 0.175 million hectares from last year. Overall, the decline in pulse acreage in key states remains a concern for kharif production. However, improved monsoon activity and irrigation support could help narrow the gap as the sowing season progresses.*
- *Tur acreage rose 1.6% to 4.566 million ha as of September 4, but prices remained firm due to concerns over crop conditions in Maharashtra and Karnataka amid uneven rainfall. Strong mill demand, limited local arrivals and higher import costs are supporting prices. Tur prices are expected to remain firm in the near term, with Gulbarga and Akola markets showing significant monthly and yearly gains.*
- *Australia Weather: Several cold fronts brought widespread rainfall across south-eastern Australia during the week, with 15–50 mm recorded across parts of Victoria, Tasmania, South Australia and New South Wales, while isolated areas received over 50 mm. Western Australia also saw rainfall, particularly across the south-west and interior, while parts of Queensland's north tropical coast received around 15 mm. The highest weekly rainfall was 160 mm at Mount Read, Tasmania, while the highest daily total was 81 mm at Perisher Valley, NSW.*
- *Edible oil prices in the global market remained mixed in the evening session. Malaysian palm oil prices also traded mixed, while soybean oil prices in Chicago strengthened. Traders said Malaysian crude palm oil futures pared their afternoon gains and closed mixed on Tuesday, as concerns over fresh buying from India and uncertainty ahead of Thursday's MPOB report kept investors cautious.*
- *Malaysian palm oil futures ended almost unchanged on September 8, with the benchmark November contract down 0.02% at RM4,977/MT. Weather-related production risks and stronger soyoil prices supported the market, while higher crude oil prices provided additional support. The weaker ringgit also aided export demand, but concerns over port congestion in India and delayed vessel unloading may limit further purchases. Traders are awaiting the upcoming MPOB data on production, stocks and demand.*

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
